Boston delivers local produce to seniors

The city of Boston is partnering with local farms to bring organic, regional produce to senior citizens through a new city program.

Enterprise Farm in South Deerfield will work with farms across Massachusetts and the eastern sea coast to deliver boxes of produce to senior citizens in three public housing developments in Mattapan and Dorchester. Health care plan Senior Whole Health is covering the expenses.
